Term 3 dates:

The afterschool clubs start on w/c Monday, April 20th. The final week for clubs is the second last week of school unless otherwise communicated by the individual club. This term is 7 to 8 weeks depending on the day the club is held.

Junior & Senior Infants:

Only three clubs take in Junior and Senior Infants: Karate, Spanish, and Science.

Take note of the 1-2 hour gap between Infants finishing school and the clubs starting at either 2.10pm or 3.15pm depending on the club. Only Spanish is open to taking in new students this term.

Priority Booking / Waiting Lists:

Some of the clubs have given priority to returning students. Remaining availability is offered in this registration. If your child is very keen on joining the club, please join the waiting list. Based on the size of the waiting list, the provider may expand the class size or allow to join mid term if any spots become available (club-specific).

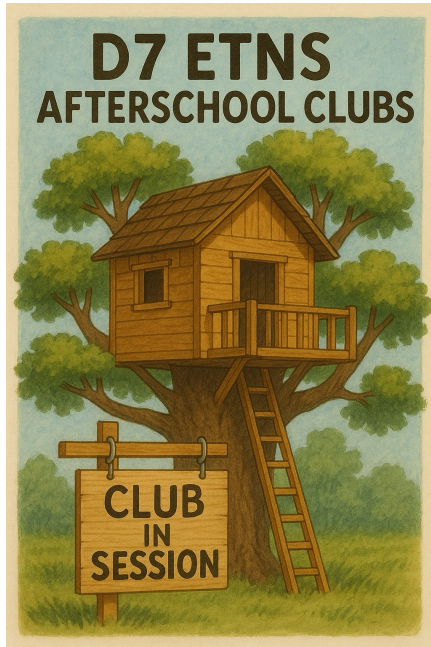

Handover of children to afterschool clubs:

The club instructors will normally wait for the children at the top of the stairs in the courtyard at 2.10pm when school finishes. Depending on the club, they may be dressed in obvious costume like a karate gi or a white lab coat. Those not in flashy gear will most likely hold up a sign with their club name. **It would help the children especially the younger ones if they are reminded in the morning of the club they are to attend that day.** The teachers will also have a list of children attending which clubs.



Handover of children from clubs to afterschool care:

If the child is also signed up to Stay and Play / Little Learners, please let both the club provider and Little Learners know. This will help make the handovers go smoothly as both can help the child if they are not unsure if they are to be collected or to go to Stay and Play. This is also helpful for when the child is coming from Homework club or Little Learners to attend a 3.10pm club.

Absences / early collection / late arrivals:

Please let the club provider know if the child will not be attending the club as it will save them time from having to contact you to confirm while also trying to start the club session. If the child needs to leave half way through, it might be best to skip the club for that week as the child will need to be brought down to the gates for collection. Depending on the club, there may only be one instructor and he or she

cannot leave the class to do this. For 3.15pm clubs, please make sure the child arrives on time as the school gates may be locked and there will be no staff at the desk to answer the buzzer.

Food:

Depending on the club, they may be allowed a small snack. Please make sure adequate amount of lunch is packed if they are to attend club that day.

Collection:

To help the instructors, please wave to your child to get their attention once you see them. Please pay special attention during pickup as sometimes the child will see you first and let their instructor know and will be let out; however, you might not see them come out looking for you. The path can get very busy and difficult for a small child to manage with tall adults walking about.
